Along with his Norwegian colleague Harald Kippenes, I will have the entire Victorinox North Pole 09 expedition kit on display for interactive viewing. In the late spring of 2005 Harald and John traveled together on the 5-man modern Amundsen Team on the Greenland ice cap for 72 days, as part of a History Channel/BBC observational documentary film project titled [The Race to the Pole](#)

. The expedition re-ran the original 1911 race for the South Pole using exclusively 1911-style clothing, equipment and food. Much of the gear from this expedition will also be on display.

It was fantastic to be on the ice in the warm April sun and unlike last year, a chance to relax from time to time in one of the most beautiful places in the world.
